This Cookie Policy is provided by Fidelity Digital Asset Services, LLC and Fidelity Digital Assets Ltd. (collectively, "Fidelity Digital Assets") to provide you information about the use of cookies and similar technologies ("cookies") on our websites and with our electronic communications and how to manage them.

What is a cookie and how does Fidelity Digital Assets use cookies?

About Cookies

Cookies are small pieces of information, stored in simple text files, that a website or online service exchanges with a web browser or application on a visitor's device (for example, a computer, tablet, or mobile phone). They are also commonly referred to as web beacons, pixels, tags, flash objects and similar terms. In this cookie policy, the term "cookie" includes all such items and similar technologies. The information stored in a cookie may relate to your browsing habits on a website, your interactions with our emails or a unique identification number so that the website can "remember" you on your return visit. Generally, cookies do not contain personal information from which you can be identified, unless you have furnished such information to the website via a login.

Cookies have different durations depending on whether they are session cookies or persistent cookies. Session cookies are temporary and expire automatically when you close your browser. Persistent cookies stay on your device until they are deleted by you or they expire automatically after a set period of time.

How does Fidelity Digital Assets use cookies?

We use cookies for various reasons. For example, we use cookies to gather information and statistics about the use of our websites to improve our performance and provide users with a better experience. We may use cookies for security purposes and to personalize your experience while visiting our websites. We may also use cookies to help us measure the efficacy of our marketing campaigns and to evaluate the effectiveness of our ads.

If you receive electronic communications from us, we use cookies to track certain actions, such as whether the communications are opened and which links you click on within those communications. This enables us to assess the effectiveness of our electronic communications and to help us better tailor our communications with you.

How You Can Manage Cookies

You can manage cookies through your web browser. Most browsers will tell you how to stop accepting new cookies, how to be notified when you receive a new cookie, and how to disable or delete existing cookies. You can find out how to do this for the browser you use by consulting the information made available by the provider of your browser.

Please note that cookies must be enabled in order to log in to our websites. If you disable cookies, you will not be able to log in and use that website.

For mobile users, you have controls in your device operating system that enables you to choose whether to allow cookies. For information on controlling your mobile choices, please visit

We may use cookies in our emails. Depending upon the email client/service that you use, you may have the option to prevent the automatic downloading of images which would suppress these cookies until images are downloaded.

What Types of Cookies Are Used?

We use cookies that are considered to be in the following categories: strictly necessary cookies, analytics cookies, functional cookies and targeting or advertising cookies. These cookies may be set by us, our service providers and in some cases, our business partners.

| Strictly Necessary Cookies | These cookies are necessary for our websites to function and cannot be switched off in our systems. You can set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but if you block these cookies, some parts of our websites will not work. These cookies do not store any personally identifiable information. The legal basis for our use of strictly necessary cookies are our legitimate interests, namely being able to provide and maintain our websites. |
| Performance Cookies | These cookies help us improve the performance of our websites by collecting and reporting information on how you use it. For example, these cookies allow us to count visits and traffic sources, identify which pages are the most and least popular, and how visitors move around our websites. All information from these cookies may be aggregated and used on an anonymous basis. |
| Functional Cookies | These cookies enable us to provide you with enhanced functionality and to personalize your experience on our websites. For example, these cookies help us to remember your preferences and to personalize content based on your use of our websites. If you do not allow these cookies, then some or all of these features may not function properly. |
| Targeting or Advertising Cookies | These cookies remember your browsing behavior while on our websites, including how you navigate to our websites from a Fidelity Digital Assets advertisement or communication. These cookies help us present relevant online advertising and marketing messages to you and measure the effectiveness of our advertising and marketing campaigns. These cookies may be placed on your device by us or by our third-party advertising partners. When these cookies have been placed on your device, they can be recognized by certain advertising platforms used by other websites you visit, and this allows us to present our advertisements to you on those third-party websites. While targeting cookies can identify you when you visit different websites, the information collected is anonymous. They do not store personal information but are based on uniquely identifying your browser and device. If you do not allow these cookies, our online advertisements that you see may be less relevant to you. |
